- c. NYSBRA-branded Junior Racing Team (update)

- i. Doug Toback (Director Sportif of Cuevas Cycling), Noel, and myself are making progress on the "NYSBRA state/Regional Junior Racing Team;" the idea is to get the best NY juniors riding together as "Team NYSBRA" at the biggest races in the Northeast/Atlantic region.
 - ii. On 22Oct we had a great kickoff telecon with NY junior team leaders (~47 invited, ~20 attended) and the consensus opinion was positive!
 - iii. Financial commitments for NYSBRA remain as previously discussed; approximately \$750 for team jerseys (up front) and \$500/event for up to six events; e.g., up to \$3,750.
 - iv. Near term goals for the team are:
 - Announcement to juniors to apply
 - A 2-day intro "training camp" c. March
 - Racing as a team at an early season race (e.g., Trooper Brinkerhoff)

 - iii. Many of you have served for a very long time and others are new. As you know, whenever someone joins the board, I have spent time with you to explain the various roles on the Board, and your specific qualifications, responsibilities, expectations, and benefits
 - iv. Much of what you do is up to you, your own initiative, and your own discretion. Your membership on the board gives you additional resources and leverage to pursue what you think is important. You control your own destiny! Leona's wonderful work with NYC juniors is a great example of how her tireless efforts have yielded concrete results!
 - v. Since we have several new members this year I have written down [my standard in-brief](#) and the roles/responsibilities of the various positions we have added to the board
 - vi. The documents describe the history of NYSBRA and the clarifies the responsibilities/benefits of each special position (i.e., the appointed positions that are in addition to the NYSBRA Board as defined in the Bylaws)
 - vii. Finally, I'd like to acknowledge that some of the board gets a very small stipend for their administrative workload as a token "thank you." This tiny stipend is not a salary and not meant as compensation; we volunteer to serve NYSBRA because we love cycling!

- **Grant Program: (Jeff Poulin)**

- a. The NYSBRA Grant Program is the best in the USA!
- b. We created NYSBRA to return the USA Cycling rebate money (~\$25,k/yr) to the State of New York and we have been wildly successful in doing exactly that!
- c. Grant Status: NYSBRA has committed about \$21,903 and actually paid out \$18,584 in grants YTD
- d. 2018 Grant Totals (as of 6Jan19):
 - i. Mission Grants (mostly rider and official clinics): 15 totaling \$5,088
 - ii. Free Entry for NYSBRA Champs: 15 totaling \$2,031
 - iii. Junior Development: 35 totaling \$3,372
 - iv. Moto Officials: 10 totaling \$1,150
 - v. New C Official license/Background fees reimbursement: 2 totaling \$102
 - vi. New C Officials at events: 21 totaling \$3,092
 - vii. New fields for Women/Juniors: 3 totaling \$500
 - viii. State Championship Events: 7 totaling \$3,000
 - ix. New Event Permit: 3 totaling \$90
 - x. NYSBRA Intro to Racing Class: 7 totaling \$1,100
- e. Unfortunately, USA Cycling continues to refuse to share their numerous fee increases with the Local Associations. In 2019 USA Cycling is once again increasing many fees, to include the (at least 4th increase in) rider license cost to \$80! Until USA Cycling agrees to fairly share these increases with Local Associations such as NYSBRA, NYSBRA will remain financially challenged to achieve our mission.
